Rémy Prud'homme

Rémy Prud'homme is presently Professor emeritus at the University of Paris XII, and consultant. He studied business administration at HEC (the n° 1 French business school), and economics at the University of Paris and at Harvard. He has been a Professor of economics at the Universities of Phnom-Penh, Lille, and Paris XII (since 1977), and also Visiting Professor at the MIT (1982-83, 1988-89, 1998 and 2002). For several years, he worked with the OECD, as deputy-director of the Environment directorate.

His main interests are in local public finance, urban and regional policies, environmental policies, transportation and energy policies. He has been a member of many French government advisory committees (such as the PEON commission that prepared the French nuclear program), and a frequent consultant to a number of governments, to international organizations, (particularly the World Bank, where he was invited as a Visiting Research Scholar, but also the European Economic Union, the OECD, or the Inter American Development Bank), and to private enterprises. He has been elected to the board of the International Institute of Public Finance, and of the French Economic Association. He created and led for 15 years L'OEIL, a small research team based at the University of Paris XII.

He has published about 15 books or pamphlets, about 180 papers in scholarly journals, and about 150 articles in *Le Monde, Le Figaro, Les Echos*, the leading French dailies.
